INCLUDED IN PRICE:

1) Round trip airfare per brochure, deluxe motor coaches, First Class / Superior First Class hotels, guided sightseeing, entrance fees to sites visited, breakfast & dinner daily per brochure; 2) Taxes and fuel charges totaling **\$590 USD** comprised of **\$259.60** for fuel charges (subject to increase by airline up to 30 days prior to departure) and **\$330.40** for taxes (including federal inspection fees for the U.S. Customs and Immigrations; international air transportation tax; agricultural tax; other per person taxes imposed by government entities; airport taxes and fees including the September 11th Security fee up to \$10 per person, passenger facility charges up to \$18 per person, federal domestic flight segment fees up to \$3.50 per segment and U.S. and International arrival and departure, and other government imposed fees up to \$300 per person); 3) Gratuities of **\$160** for tour guide or cruise director, local host, driver, local guides, and/or ships' crew; gratuities on ferries, and cruise ships.

NOT INCLUDED IN PRICE:

Not included in your package are passports, visas, vaccinations, laundry, lunches, telephone, mini-bar, alcohol, other beverages, and food outside of the contracted tour operator menu as presented at a hotel or restaurant (these extra items will be billed to you before leaving the hotel, or restaurant), airport transfers on non-qualifying flights, portage at airports, travel insurance, excess baggage fees, any fees or fuel surcharges imposed by the airlines after the date you register for your trip, and all other items not specifically mentioned.

PAYMENT:

A full deposit of \$500 per person is required at time of registration. Final payment must be made in the form of a check (**credit cards are only accepted for initial deposit, any remaining payments must be in check form**) and is due no later than **90-days prior to departure**. Registrations received after 90-days prior to departure **must be accompanied by full payment. There may be a late fee of \$195 for all payments or new registrations received 75-60 days prior to departure**. All tour prices are based on a minimum group size of 20 passengers for prices to be valid. If group size is 19-15 travelers, a \$150 per person supplement to price may apply. If group size is 14-10 travelers, a \$195 per person supplement to price may apply. If group size is less than 10 travelers, the tour may be cancelled due to lack of participation. **If final (full) payment is not received by Imagine Tours and Travel, LLC (hereafter referred to as Imagine) 60-days prior to departure, you will be automatically cancelled from the tour and your initial deposit of \$500 will be forfeited.** Imagine reserves the right to add a surcharge if the dollar declines by more than 2% against the shekel or euro based on foreign exchange rates in effect on date (03/17/20) when your tour was booked by your tour leader/church. All payments are required in US Funds.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

Price is based on double occupancy (two persons sharing a room). When available, single rooms are often smaller than doubles. While Imagine will try to match roommates, we cannot guarantee one will be available. Roommates may be assigned as late as 60 days prior to departure. If one is not available or if you request a single room, there will be a **single room supplement charge: \$862 for basic itinerary; additional \$255 for optional extension.**

ITINERARY and CHANGES:

Because airlines often change flight schedules after brochures are printed, Imagine reserves the right to shorten or lengthen the itinerary accordingly. You will be notified in writing when possible. If itinerary changes necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged \$195 per night/per person (single rooms \$225/night). Meals for extra nights are not included. **Any changes and/or deviations from the program and/or departure city listed by the passenger must be provided in writing to Imagine no later than 75-days prior to departure and any extra costs incurred will be billed to the passenger.** All deviations are subject to a standard fee of \$150 plus any applicable airline fees.

All tours are final at 60-days prior to departure. No changes and/or additions may be made to the tour after that time.

LAND ONLY:

Land Only price is \$3095 per person. Price does not include international flights. Land Only passengers may be responsible for transfers and/or additional overnights incurred by booking their own flights. We recommend you purchase a ticket which can be changed without large penalties, as the group's flights may change. Passengers changing from the regular tour to Land Only after 120 days prior to departure will be charged a fee of \$150 per person.

AIRLINE TICKETS:

In order to keep prices low, Imagine does not guarantee you will be on the most direct flights to your final destination. Imagine also does not guarantee the group will be on the same flights. Flight routings are chosen by the airlines and not Imagine. Airline tickets cannot be changed or refunded once issued. Air transportation to/from your destination will be economy class aboard IATA and ARC carriers utilizing APEX or SUPER APEX non-refundable, non-amendable tickets for groups of 10 or more flying together for entire itinerary. Imagine is unable to use individual frequent flyer

points to upgrade or accept them as partial payment for air transportation. Deviations by the passenger, from the group's scheduled flights, could result in different routings/air carriers.

VISAS:

Applicable visas will be obtained by Imagine for U.S. and Canadian Citizens only. All passengers who do not carry U.S. or Canadian Passports will be responsible for obtaining visas to the countries they are visiting. Imagine is not responsible for non-U.S. & Canadian Passport holders.

FLIGHT TIMES:

All flight times are subject to change by the airlines without advance notice. Imagine is not responsible for such changes or delays and does not reimburse expenses resulting from such delays. If making your own flight arrangements to a departure city or any other portion of your trip, we recommend you purchase a ticket which can be changed without large penalties. Passengers are responsible for reconfirming their flights with the airline 24 hours prior to departure.

CANCELLATION FEES:

If the tour is cancelled due to lack of participation, there will be a charge of \$150 deducted from the amount refunded to each passenger for administrative fees plus any airline penalties if applicable. Any passenger cancelling from the day of registration to 100 days prior to departure will be charged a \$300 non-refundable administrative fee per person plus any airline penalties, if applicable. You will also be charged a single room fee if your cancellation forces your roommate into a single room from 59 days prior until the date of departure. The following charges also apply: 99-60 days = \$500; 59-45 days = \$1750; 44-25 days = 75% of total cost; 24 days to day of departure = 100% of total cost. **All Cancellations must be received in writing. Day 1 – Friday, February 5: Depart U.S.A.

Tour members meet for our flight. After dinner is served, sit back and relax, enjoying the on-board entertainment as you prepare for this exciting adventure of a lifetime.

Day 2 – Saturday, February 6: Tel Aviv, Netanya

Upon arrival at Ben Gurion Airport, we meet our local Israeli representative who assists us with baggage and transfers us to our motor coach. We take a short drive to our hotel in Netanya for dinner and overnight beside the beautiful Mediterranean Sea.

Day 3 – Sunday, February 7: Caesarea, Megiddo, Church of Annunciation, Nazareth Village, Precipice of Nazareth, Tiberias

After an abundant breakfast buffet, we journey north along the coast to Caesarea, built 2000 years ago by King Herod. We walk through the ancient theater, the Crusader city, and the fantastic aqueduct that served as a backdrop for the book of Acts. From here we depart to Megiddo (Armageddon; 1 Kings 9:15; Rev. 16:16), a city with 26 layers of occupation and 2,500 years of history. Following our visit here, we cross the Jezreel Valley to Nazareth. Driving into this city, we will briefly visit the Church of Annunciation (Luke 1), We will also experience the Nazareth Village, complete with reenactments of how people lived in Jesus' day. We end the day on the precipice of Nazareth (Luke 4). Here we gain an incredible view of the Jezreel Valley below. We will also pause for a brief time of reflection and worship here too. Driving through Cana (John 2), we finally arrive at the outskirts of Tiberias (John 6:23). We arrive at our "kibbutz-hotel" located right on the Sea of Galilee shoreline. After a late dinner, we enjoy a free evening.



Day 4 – Monday, February 8: Hazor, Dan, Caesarea Philippi, Tel Dan, Syrian Border, Sussita/Hippos

We begin early today by driving to the northern end of the Sea of Galilee to Hazor, the largest archaeological site of Israel. Located in the Huleh Valley, this 200-acre site first inhabited by Canaanites was conquered by Joshua (Josh. 11). Later, King Solomon refortified the city. Continuing north, we visit the amazing nature preserve and archaeological site of Tel Dan. First, we walk through this quiet national park along the upper Jordan River. Then we will sit on the steps of the high place and hear the stories that took place here (Judges 18, 1 Kings 12). Next, we visit Caesarea Philippi. It was here Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do you say I am?" (Mt. 16). We will see the ruins from the grotto area of the city. From here we drive east to the border with Syria. We will pass Mt. Hermon (Ps. 133) on the way. At the border we learn about the modern wars of Israel, primarily the 1967 and 1973 wars with Syria. Returning to the Sea of Galilee, we will pass Gamla (a 1st century Jewish site), Bethsaida (the home of Peter, Andrew, and Phillip, John 1), the area of the Feeding of the 5,000 (John 6), and Kursi (where the demoniac was healed by Jesus, Mark 5). Our final stop is Hippo, one of the Decapolis cities overlooking the Sea of Galilee (please note: this site is not developed for tours, so it does require some steep hiking to the top of the site). We then drive back to our hotel in Tiberias. After dinner, we meet down by the water's edge once again to review the day.

Day 5 – Tuesday, February 9: Arbel, Yardenit, Magdala, Capernaum, Mt. of Beatitudes, Sea of Galilee Boat Ride

We begin the day by visiting Arbel, a mountain on the northwest

corner of the Sea of Galilee. We will have the option to hike to the top of this 800- foot cliff (the bus will take others to the top from the other side). The view from the top is the best there is of the whole Sea of Galilee below! Driving south to the southern end of the Sea of Galilee, we arrive at Yardenit. You will have the opportunity to reaffirm your baptism in the waters of the Jordan River. From here we drive to back to the NW corner of the lake to Magdala, the home of Mary Magdalene. Here we will see another 1st century synagogue. Jesus must have taught from here! Among the other ruins are ritual baths. After lunch we visit Capernaum, the home center of ministry for Jesus here in Galilee. Here we read about the many stories related to the ministry of Jesus in the 4th-5th century synagogue. We also spend some reflection time on the shoreline. It was in this area where Jesus called His first disciples. Close by we visit the Mount of Beatitudes. Here we read portions of the Sermon on the Mount from Matthew 5. We take time to reflect upon this very significant kingdom message of Jesus. We end the day with a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee, with a quiet and peaceful worship service. Upon landing, we also see the "Jesus boat" from the first century, a vessel found here along the shores of Galilee in 1986. We return to our hotel for dinner and an optional gathering once again by the water.

Day 6 – Wednesday, February 10: Beth Shean, Shiloh, Jericho, Judean Desert, Jericho

We begin the day by driving south to the Jordan Valley to the site of Beth Shean (1 Sam. 31), an impressive Roman city of the Decapolis. Driving south along the Jordan Valley and then turning west into the area of Samaria, we visit the rather new excavations of Shiloh. This is where the Tabernacle once stood. Here we see impressive archaeological ruins dating to the days of Samuel. Driving past Bethel (Gen. 12, 28) and through the Desert of Parath (Jeremiah 13), our next stop is Jericho. After a late lunch here, we climb the tel (ancient mound) to see portions of the fortification wall that supported the mud-brick walls that "came tumblin' down" (Joshua 6). From here we drive to the southern end of the Dead Sea to our hotel. Prior to dinner, you will have a chance to float in the salt and mineral-rich waters of this unique body of water!

Day 7 – Thursday, February 11: Masada, Ein Gedi, Qumran, Wilderness of Judah, Jerusalem

This morning we begin our drive northward along the western coastline of the Dead Sea to Masada. Here we ascend high upon the wilderness mountain by way of cable car to the fortress built by King Herod. We survey the ruins of the fortifications, waterworks, synagogue, temples and palaces. An optional walk down the Snake Path will be offered. Our next stop is Ein Gedi, where David hid from King Saul, and we enjoy a walk to some of the waterfalls in the canyon. Finally, we visit Qumran and the settlement of the first century sect known as the Essenes, the authors of the Dead Sea Scrolls. Over the lunch hour, you will have the opportunity to explore the famous Cave 1 where the first Dead Sea Scrolls were found in 1947. En route to Jerusalem, we end the day with a brief stop at Wadi Qelt. Here we hear the words of Isaiah 40 and Psalm 23 in the context of the Judea Desert. From here we drive the rest of the way to Jerusalem for overnight. After checking in our hotel and dinner, an optional walk to the Western Wall will take place.

Day 8 – Friday, February 12: Mt. of Olives, Garden of Gethsemane, Pool of Bethesda, Israel Museum, Yad Vashem

We get our first glimpse of Jerusalem from the Mt. of Olives, beholding a breath-taking panorama of the Holy City. We walk down the "Palm Sunday" route to the Garden of Gethsemane. Next, we enter the Old City of Jerusalem through the Lion's Gate (St. Stephens) and visit the Pools of Bethesda (John 5). We also enjoy some marvelous singing in St. Anne's church from the Crusader period. Our walk through the Old City will take us to the Christian Quarter and to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. In the afternoon after lunch, we see the fascinating Israel Museum and the model of Jerusalem (1:50 scale model of Herodian Jerusalem as it would have archaeological museum. We end the day

with a visit to Yad Vashem, Israel's Holocaust Museum. We see the Children's Memorial and walk through the museum on our own. We return to our hotel in Jerusalem for dinner and a free evening to allow you to explore or relax.

Day 9 – Saturday, February 13: Herodium, Bethlehem, Shepherd's Fields (Church of Nativity - Optional), The "shephelah" – Lowlands of Judah – Lachish, Qeiyafa & Elah Valley, Beth Shemesh & Sorek Valley, Gezer & Aijalon Valley, Jerusalem

We begin the day by driving south east of Jerusalem to Herodium. This was a palace-fortress built by Herod the Great. It was also where King Herod was buried. Next, we go to the Shepherds' Fields for a quiet time of reflecting upon God's redemptive history. Then in Bethlehem we visit an olive wood factory and store (during this time, an option will be given to go to the Church of Nativity, a 4th century AD church). In the afternoon we drive west to the Shephelah (lowlands) of Judah. As time permits, we first visit Lachish, a city that was conquered by the Assyrians (2 Chronicles 32). Here, we see where the famous "Lachish Letters" were discovered. Next, we travel to Tel Kh. Qeiyafa (biblical Shaaryim?) and see where David fought Goliath (1 Samuel 17). As we listen to the story, we see how this famous battle took place! From here, we pass Beth Shemesh and the Sorek Valley. It was here where the Ark of the Covenant was returned by the Philistines (1 Samuel 6). We end the day at Gezer and the Aijalon Valley. Here we see ruins from Solomon's day and beyond. The famous "Gezer calendar" was found here. We drive back to Jerusalem for dinner and another optional walk.

Day 10 – Sunday, February 14: City of David, Hezekiah's Tunnel, Southern Wall Excavations, Western Wall, A Few Free Hours, Garden Tomb

We begin the day by visiting the City of David and the new excavations of David's palace. Those who want to will take an optional adventurous walk through the water of Hezekiah's Tunnel (1,720 feet long). We then sit on the steps of the Siloam Pool and listen to the story of John 9. From here, we walk up through an exposed Herodian drainage channel that takes us to "Robinson's Arch" and the southern wall excavations. We walk on a Roman street and ascend the Temple steps. We eat lunch in the Jewish Quarter (not included) and enjoy a few hours of free time (or visit the Western Wall). Our day ends at the Garden Tomb for Communion, and we return to our hotel for a Farewell Dinner. Then we transfer to the airport for our return flight home. (Passengers with Jordan extension return to the hotel for overnight)

Day 11 – Monday, February 15: Arrive Home

We arrive back in the U.S.A. After going through U.S. Customs, we board our domestic flight back to our homes at the end of a life-transforming trip!

Day 11 – Monday, February 15: Allenby Bridge, Mt. Nebo, Macharus, Petra

We begin the day by driving south to the Jordan Valley and the Allenby Bridge. Here we make the crossing from Israel to Jordan. After border formalities, we meet our Jordanian guide and bus and drive to Mt. Nebo to stand where Moses stood and viewed the Holy Land (Deut. 34). Here you can take in a breathtaking view across the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea. We continue to Macherus, one of Herod's palace-

fortresses. It was here where John the Baptist was beheaded (Mark 6). In the late afternoon, we drive south down the Desert Highway to Petra, where we spend the night. We arrive at our hotel and enjoy a late dinner together.

Day 12 – Tuesday, February 16: Petra, Wadi Rum

We arrive this morning at the entrance of Petra and spend the entire day within this red-rose ancient city. We are in the heart of the Seir Mountains, Land of Edomites, mentioned in the Bible in Genesis. These mountains house the Aaron Peak, the highest in Petra and the burial place of Moses' brother Aaron. A walk through the Siq, the main entrance to Petra, brings us to the first monument "The Treasury" "Al-Khazneh" a dramatic site. This well-preserved monumental tomb appears in the movie "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade." A walk further down through the outer siq with all of its tombs and burial chamber brings us to one of the largest theaters in Jordan. A 3000-seat theater from the early first century is carved in the sandstone mountains at the bottom of the High Place of Sacrifice Mountain. Apparently some sacrificial rituals had taken place here. From here we walk uphill to the Royal Tombs for a great view of the lower part of Petra with all its Roman remains. There will be the option to walk to the "Monastery" of Petra and/or the High Place. Leaving the site of Petra in mid-afternoon, we drive south to Wadi Rum. Here we enjoy an amazing jeep ride in the desert. We then stay in Wadi Rum at Captain's, a Bedouin Village. We enjoy dinner together and a devotional time under the stars. It will be a unique experience!






Day 13 – Wednesday, February 17: Southern Border Crossing into Israel, Red Sea, Timnah, Tel Aviv, Night Flight Home

Following breakfast, we leave Wadi Rum and drive to the southern border to cross back into Israel. Greeted once again by our Israeli guide and bus, we make a brief stop to see the coral reefs of the Red Sea. We will have a chance to swim in these crystal-clear waters. From here we drive north through the Aravah (Rift Valley) to Timnah. In ancient days, this was a copper mine of the Egyptians. We also walk through a full-size replica of the Old Testament Tabernacle. Continuing north, we drive back to the Tel Aviv area through the Machtsh Ramon, Israel's "Grand Canyon." We also drive through the Desert of Zin (Numbers 13) where the 12 spies explored the land. Back in the Tel Aviv area we have dinner before arriving at the airport for our night flight home.

Day 14 – Thursday, February 18: Arrive Home

We arrive back in the U.S.A. After going through U.S. Customs, we board our domestic flight back to our homes at the end of a life-transforming trip!
